Attacks Against Members of the LGBTQ+ Community in Afghanistan July 2021 to November 2023

Report by Liv Wittenberg, Tufts University, December 2023

Note: The attacks below likely represent only a fraction of all attacks perpetrated against members of the LGBTQ+ community in Afghanistan since July 2021. This is particularly the case because many surviving victims or families, friends, and neighbors of victims are attempting to maintain the sexuality and gender identity of the victim a secret, and are thus reluctant to report. Many stories are told in reports, but are anonymized and without detail. They are included in the section for the month in which they were published.

08/15/2021	Kabul	A gay man, boyfriend to "Gabir", was abducted from his home and killed by the Taliban on the same day they overtook Kabul. He was returned to his family's home in pieces to show the Afghan people "this is what we do to gay people". The couple were planning to leave Afghanistan to marry when the Taliban took over. Gabir then started getting death threats from the Taliban that they knew he was gay, who his gay friends were, and "if we find you, we will kill you."	Pink News

Sometime in August 2021	Anonymous	Bilal Saraj, an anonymized member of the queer community is captured and tortured by the Taliban. Bilal was tied against a metal rod and had ice water thrown in his face nightly, in attempts to film a confession for use in a trial against him. He was also hit with cable lines, the butts of guns, and sticks. One night, after being beaten senseless, Bilal awoke to sleeping guards and fled into Pakistan, where he is still in hiding.	Vice News
August 28, 2021	Kabul	A former doctor named Allahyar was stopped by Taliban guards at the hospital where he worked, punched repeatedly, and suffered blood clots and severe eye damage. He suspects his former hospital colleagues informed the Taliban of his sexual identity. After the incident, his hospital threw him out.	Vice News

Sapna was forced to relocate to Pakistan when her brothers threatened to murder her if she didn't leave their home. She fled to Pakistan where she worked as a domestic laborer and sex worker, where she contracted AIDS.
